## Message from our President

### Did you know . . .

- We performed our first surgeries in October 2000, altering a total of 15 cats that month.
- Our first BIG FIX was in April 2001. We altered 25 cats at that BIG FIX.
- At each BIG FIX, we currently use an average of 6 volunteer veterinarians and 70 other volunteers to alter an average of 140 cats.
- After each BIG FIX, we care for an average of 10 cats that need some basic, simple medical care before being returned to their colonies.
- We use an average of 9 trained volunteer trappers at each BIG FIX to help trap for caretakers who are disabled or elderly.
- We perform amputations, remove eyes and tails, patch up wounds, and shave mats of those kitties going through our BIG FIX who need that kind of care.

- Through our Quick Fix program, we alter an average of 25 cats per month.
- We board cats both the night before and the night after their surgeries for both the Quick Fix and the BIG FIX program.
- We hold volunteer orientations every other month for people who want to learn more about what we do and sign up to help.
- We distribute a *Volunteer Gazette* six times a year to volunteers to keep them up-to-date on activities of the group. The Volunteer Gazette is mounted on our website as well.
- We refer callers whose needs don't match our services to other groups in the community and, likewise, receive referrals from other groups when we can help.
- We altered our 10,106th cat in March 2007.


