What about a kitten with a painfully ruptured eye? A cat whose abscess that had turned into a gaping wound? What about one left suffering and vulnerable from a broken leg?

We made a decision 25 years ago that we stand by today: Euthanizing treatable cats was not something we wanted to do. We decided that these conditions should be addressed.

A Decade-Long Love Story That Starts With You!

Sophie and Janet shared a love story that was meant to be.

Sophie, a beautiful tortoiseshell cat who lived outside, came into Janet's life in 2014. Janet contacted Alley Cat Advocates to have Sophie spayed. Below, Janet shares the rest of their story with you ...

After Sophie was spayed, we released her near our back deck. Then, she left for a long time. I thought she was gone forever.

Then one day there she was, feral as ever, but hungry. That's when our relationship began. It took months before she allowed me to pet her. The next step was to transition her feedings to my covered back deck.

The rest is history. Sophie went on to become one of the sweetest, most loving, outdoor cats I've ever had. She always wore a ea collar and let me take her to the vet when needed. She let me brush her and rub her belly. Still, she let me know she would never live indoors.

So for the last decade, Sophie lived on my covered upper deck, right outside my kitchen door. She'd come inside and hang out, and would sit and stare at me until I'd pet her. She never took a bite of her breakfast until I patted her head. I think that was her way of saying "thank you."

Each night, she slept in a cushioned deck chair, or came inside during cold weather. But that deck was always her home. She loved her big yard and was a good hunter. On sunny days, she liked to lay in the sunshine.

Then one day, Sophie began to lose her voice. She allowed me to take her to the vet, who started her on antibiotics and steroids. But ultimately, he found that a large, inoperable tumor had engulfed her vocal cords. I had to make the decision to let her go. Sophie crossed the Rainbow Bridge on Valentine's Day, 2024. My heart is broken.

Rest easy, sweet Sophie. You may have left my life, but you will always be in my heart. You were such a wonderful gift and a blessing. Thank you for the love. You will always be my Valentine Alley Cat.
